




History of Benchmarking & planning tool development



Benchmarking & Planning tool for children and adolescents TB

- This tool is included in the latest WHO roadmap for TB in children and adolescents and can be downloaded from the KNCV website
- It's a self-assessment and planning tool and serves basis for discussions, brainstorming, and strategic planning on childhood TB
- It is recently updated to reflect latest WHO guidance and recommendations





Benchmarking & planning tool serves as a basis for..

- Monitoring progress in implementation of policies on the management of TB in children and adolescents in line with most recent WHO guidance, within the framework of a national TB programme
- Assess strategic planning and inclusion of children and adolescents
- Stakeholder mapping project activities, timelines and intervention areas, support for children and adolescents
- Interview of HCW general knowledge, capacity, resources, readiness to conduct TB screening, etc.





Experience of initial KNCV benchmarking tool, Country feedback 2017

Use in 3 Countries:

- Indonesia
- Nepal
- Vietnam

Feedback:

The process was appreciated as it was recognised as a national self-assessment exercise, which served to facilitate communication and exchange between key stakeholders, leading to a better understanding of the status of childhood TB in Nepal. It further enabled the stakeholders to formulate and prioritise recommendations to the NTP towards the development of a national roadmap for childhood TB. And lastly, it enabled the NTP to solicit buy-in, support and commitment from key stakeholders.

Missing:

The Childhood TB Benchmarking tool does not currently cover social protection, stigma and human rights issues. Due to time limitations, it was not possible to address these issues during the workshop. However, from feedback received from conversations and side meetings during the mission, these seem to be very important issues to address in reducing service access barriers for affected children and their families. We would therefore recommend to address these in a separate stakeholder consultation meeting, which, naturally, needs to have representation from affected populations.



What has changed in the tool from 2017 to 2024

- Number of indicators remained 12, but number of benchmarks increased from 77 to 94
- The language changed from "childhood TB" to now called "TB in children and adolescents"
- Increased collection of aggregated data on children and adolescents and age bands
- Including Healthcare workers interviews
- Including Stakeholders framework






